

Cotton or cotton blend gloves are traditional work gloves used in many industries due to their superior comfort and protection against dirt and grime.

Categories of gloves include:

Strings: General purpose gloves that provide moderate protection from both heat and cold. Gauge references the number of rows of stitches per inch. A higher gauge means less bulk and greater dexterity.

Dotted/Coated: Ideal for material handlers due to the enhanced grip, added protection and extended wear provided by the dots or palm coating.

Jersey: A comfortable alternative that comes in a variety of weights for general-duty and light abrasion application. The traditional dark color hides dirt well.

Chore: The cotton shell provides the protection needed for general purpose or light duty jobs. Lining offers comfort and good heat dispersion.

Hotmill: These multilayered gloves offer greater protection for extended exposure to moderate heat. Heavy duty liners trap hot air improving insulating characteristics.

Terry: Provide moderate thermal protection and cut resistance.
